## **Senior Survey Results – Class of 2017**

### **Breakdown for Class of 2017 (total 141 students)**

**Students attending a 4-year college – 49.6%**

**Students attending a 2-year college – 42%**

**Students with other plans – 8%**

### **How do these compare to PGHS past years?**

**Class of 2016:** 43% reported planning to attend a 4-year college.  
52% reported planning to attend a 2-year college.  
5% reported having other plans.

**Class of 2015:** 42% reported planning to attend a 4-year college.  
52% reported planning to attend a 2-year college.  
6% reported having other plans.

**Class of 2014:** 40% reported planning to attend a 4-year college.  
50% reported planning to attend a 2-year college.  
10% reported having other plans.

**Class of 2013:** 38% reported planning to attend a 4-year college.  
55% reported planning to attend a 2-year college.  
7% reported having other plans.

**Class of 2012:** 47% reported planning to attend a 4-year college.
