# 10 ESSENTIAL TIPS & TOOLS FOR JUNIORS: CLASS OF 2025

# 1. REVIEW YOUR TRANSCRIPT

#### YOUR TRANSCRIPT

Your PGHS transcript is an important document for both high school graduation and college admission. All students should check over their transcript to make sure it is correct.

#### How do you get a copy of your transcript?

PGHS uses Parchment.com, an online transcript service, allowing you to order official and unofficial transcripts to be sent electronically. Please use the following link and instructions to enable you to create a Parchment account and order official or unofficial transcripts.

Note: Please DO NOT use your school issued email address, as your school account will eventually become inactive

## 2. CONSIDER TAKING A DUAL ENROLLMENT COURSE

### DUAL ENROLLMENT (DE) COURSES

A DE course is a community college course in which you get both high school and college credit.

• Some MPC Culinary, Photography, and Computer DE courses are offered on our PGHS campus during the regular school day. Students sign up for these at PGHS during course selection.

 Some DE classes are offered at the MPC campus or online.
 Students sign up for these by going to the MPC website (mpc.edu) to see what courses are available.

#### BENEFITS & RISKS OF TAKING A DE CLASS

#### **Benefits**

- Tuition is waived for high school students.
- All DE courses of 3 credits or more are given an extra point in the grade point average.
  - An opportunity to get a head start on some required college courses.
    - Excellent advantage for college applications.

#### Risks

Remember that a DE class is a college class and the grade you earn will follow you to college as part of your college transcript. Make sure you are ready to study and do well in your college class.

### 4. KEEP COLLEGE OPTIONS OPEN

#### KEEP COLLEGE OPTIONS OPEN

Continue to meet A-G requirements for 4-year college eligibility with the high school classes you choose even if you plan to go to a community college after high school.

Take advanced math, take a second year of language, take another science course. Even if you go to MPC these will help keep your academic skills sharp and it gives you the option to change your mind in senior year if you want to apply to a 4-year college.

Now is the time to start thinking about careers:

Considering a field in the trades: Carpenter, Electrician, Plumber, HVAC? *Explore apprenticeships*.

Interested in other professional careers? Explore summer internships.

Wonder what a day in the life of an Interior Designer is like? Or Accountant? Or Attorney? Consider planning an Informational Interview or Job Shadow.

# 7. CHECK ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR YOUR COLLEGES

### CHECK THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE COLLEGES YOU ARE INTERESTED IN

• The UC, CSU and California Community College campuses do not require or consider SAT/ACT test scores for admission. Other colleges may still have testing requirements.

• Academic requirements vary for private colleges and public colleges outside of CA. Example: The U of Arizona requires 3 years of a lab science, but the UC/CSU campuses only require 2 years. Make sure you are meeting the requirements of the colleges you are planning to apply to.

As juniors, some scholarships may be available, although a majority are not available until senior year.
