


### **Open Period**

What is an Open Period? An Open Period is a class period in which you are not assigned a class.

- 9th Grade Open periods are available in only 7th or 8th period.
- Open periods are assigned based on the student's schedule, not on preferred periods of the day.
- Open periods are not guaranteed.
  - If a student is credit deficient or needs additional support due to failing or near failing grades, a support classes may be added to the student schedule.
- Open periods require parent/guardian permission.

Monterey Peninsula College (Live Link 🔶 )

- There are 116 California Community Colleges
  - Monterey Peninsula College (MPC) is our local community college
- Community Colleges offer students the opportunity to earn:
  - Dual Enrollment college credits while still in high school
  - Certificates (COA, COT, COC)
  - Two-year Associate Degrees (AA or AS)
  - Associate Degree for Transfer (AA-T or AS-T)
- With an AA/AS, COA, COT, or COC students can join the workforce in 2 years or less
- The UCs and CSUs have transfer programs to support admissions for students who have completed their Associate Degrees for Transfer (AA-T or AS-T).

#### **Required Academic Classes**

### **SOCIAL SCIENCE (HISTORY)**

**World Geography:** For all 9th grade students. World Geography will develop the basic themes of physical, cultural, and political geography while focusing on both domestic and international current events. Academic skills such as communication, collaboration, critical thinking, time management, academic organization, and note-taking will all be a part of this course.



#### **Required Academic Classes**

#### **SCIENCE**

**Biology:** For all 9th grade students. Biology is a two-semester laboratory-oriented class covering the study of plants and animals. It is designed to build from concrete to abstract concepts such as cell theory, photosynthesis, genetics, to ecology and environmental issues.

#### **Required Classes**

#### **PHYSICAL EDUCATION**

Individual And Dual Sports: For all 9th grade students. This course meets the graduation requirement for the first year of Physical Education. Instruction focuses on physical fitness and the following sports and activities: Aquatics, Badminton, Dance, Golf, Pickleball, Self-Defense, Tennis, Track and Field, and Wrestling.

#### **ENGLISH**


**English 1**: For students currently working at or above grade level.

Honors English 1: Honors English 1 is for the highly motivated English student who has exceptional reading, writing, and comprehension skills. Honors students should be self-driven and should be able to meet the time and organizational demands of this more rigorous course.

# **Advancement Via Individual Determination**

- AVID students are first generation, college bound students and/or historically underrepresented in four year colleges and universities
- College tutors provide guidance during tutorials twice per week
- AVID offers college campus visits once per semester
- AVID's focus is on improving Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization and Reading
- AVID students are required to take four years of math at PGHS and be dedicated to meeting the UC A-G requirements, including maintaining Cs or higher in all classes

### **Academic Support Classes**

# Integrated Math Support

Mathematics Support is offered to students concurrently enrolled in an Integrated Math course to provide them with additional help. This course reviews basic mathematical concepts, reinforces material currently covered in their math class, and previews additional material to help students succeed.

# Independent Productive Study (IPS)

This class is for completing unfinished classwork, homework assignments/projects, and studying for upcoming tests/quizzes.

The class is scheduled during the school day and attendance is taken.


### **Frequently Asked Questions**


- 3. I am not sure how many classes to take. Can I sign up for the maximum and then just drop one next year if my schedule is too hard?
